"Hebrews #11"

Hebrews 9: 15 – 28 / 10: 1-10

Review: Last week we looked at the old external acts of worship within the earthly tabernacle... How the old covenant laid the foundation for the new covenant. (Shadow of the real)

- How the articles, sacrifices and worship in the old tabernacle pointed to Christ Jesus... To the ultimate and final Sacrifice, once and for all!
- > The old represented the tabernacle in heaven and the holy of holies in heaven... When Jesus said it is finished, He entered the most holy place.
- What was the sign? Vail rent into...

Last week... Hebrews 9: 11-14 (Read)

- Christ purifies our conscience from dead works... which the law could never do!
- Dead works can never justify us... Only faith in Christ Jesus!

Which brings us to our study tonight:

(Text) 9: 15 (Read) ... He is the mediator of a new covenant.

Advocate... always making intercession for us... This is important to understand!

Hebrews 7:25 "Therefore He is also able to save to the uttermost those who come to Him, since He always lives to make intercession for them." (NKJV)

(Text) 9: 16-22 (Read)

V's 16-18 Message Bible

"Like a will that takes effect when someone dies, the new covenant was put into action at Jesus' death. His death marked the transition from the old plan to the new one... Even the first plan required a death to set it in motion."

"Without the shedding of blood there is no forgiveness of sins." (V22)

(Text) 9: 23-24 (Read)

Remember, when Jesus cried out it is finished; at that very moment, He entered heaven into the holy of holies, in the presents of God... "On our behalf."

What did the centurion guard say...? "Surely this man was the Son of God."

Mark 15:39, Matt 27:54... Luke 23:44-48 (V47) "When the centurion saw what happened, he glorified God, saying, certainly this was a righteous Man." (NKJV)

V24... Message Bible: "Christ didn't enter the earthly version of the holy place; He entered the place itself and offered Himself to God as the sacrifice for our sins."

(Text) 9:25-28 (Read)

He's coming again, not to deal with sin but to save those who are waiting for Him.

(Text) 10: 1-7 (Read)...

> V5 Consequently, when Christ came...

Quote from: Psalms 40:6-8

"Sacrifice and offering you did not desire; My ears You have opened. Burnt offering and sin offering You did not require. Then I said, behold, I come; In the scroll of the book, it is written of Me. I delight to do your will, O my God, and Your law is within my heart." (NKJV)

(Text) 10:8-10 (Read)

- So, what does He take pleasure in?
- Faith and trust in His sacrifice... and His complete forgiveness.
- Sanctified through the offering of His body and blood.
- "Not of works lest any man boast."

Psalms 40:1-4 "I waited patiently for the Lord; and He inclined to me and heard my cry. He also brought me up out of a horrible pit, out of the miry clay and set my feet upon a rock and established my steps. He has put a new song in my mouth... Blessed is the man who makes the Lord his trust..."
